Abelia

grandiflora - A vigorous arching medium-sized semi-evergreen shrub. Fragrant white flowers appear from July to September above narrow glossy green leaves. Prefers full sun and drainage. Height to 2m. A superb shrub that deserves wider planting.

For Abeliophyllum see Climbers and Wall shrubs Section

Aucuba - 'Japanese Laurel'

japonica 'Rozannie' - A hardy evergreen shrub which forms a dense rounded bush. Leaves are shiny, dark green and attractively shaped. Self pollinating, so bears large red fruits. Ideal for shady or polluted sites, in any reasonable garden soils.

japonica 'Variegata' - Evergreen, medium sized female shrub with rounded dense habit and large, glossy, yellow speckled leaves. Ideal for very shady conditions, thriving in almost any soil or situation.

Berberis - Barberry

darwinii - Vigorous, evergreen, arching shrub. Has small glossy, dark green leaves and a profusion of rounded, deep orange-yellow flowers from mid- to late spring followed by bluish berries. Easy to cultivate and thrives in any well drained soil.

julianae - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub. Has glossy, dark green leaves, yellow flowers in late spring and early summer and egg-shaped, blue black fruits in autumn. Ideal for screening, full sun or partial shade. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.2m+

'Amstelveen' - A dense upright growing evergreen. Blue/green leaves and red/bronze twigs give all year round interest. Well drained soil in sun or shade. Height to 1.5m. Spread 80cm.

x media 'Parkjuweel' - Good evergreen ground cover, bushy & dense. Has glossy, dark green leaves, with good autumnal colours. Will grow in almost any situation.

x media 'Red Jewel' - Dense, small semi-evergreen prickly shrub. Leaves becoming dark metallic purple. Any well drained soil in sun or part shade.

Buddleia - Butterfly Bush

alternifolia - an attractive Buddleia—rather different to the normal kinds, Willowy ,wispy stems with small lance-shaped leaves are smothered in clusters of pinky-purple flowers in

early summer. Best when allowed to trail down over lower ground covering plants. The flowers are produced on two-year old wood, so no spring pruning for this one!! Prune after flowering if required.

dauidii 'Lochinch' - One of the best. Huge spikes of soft lilac-pink over grey leaves - a real stunner in late July and August when in flower.

dauidii 'Nanho Blue' - Deciduous, fast and easy to grow. Slender arching stems form graceful yet compact bushes. Grey/green leaves contrast with the honey-scented violet-blue flowers in July/August. Loved by butterflies. Any soil, but preferring it dry and sunny. Height and spread 1.5m(5ft).

dauidii 'Royal Red' - An unusual colour - a velvet-red. Attractive to butterflies.

dauidii 'White Cloud' - Deciduous, bushy shrub. Scented spikes of pure white flowers in dense panicles appear during July to September. Requires any well drained soil. Prefers a sunny position. Height up to 2.5m.

x **weyeriana 'Golden Glow'** - A vigorous, deciduous, bushy shrub with ball-shaped heads of orange-yellow, flushed lilac flowers, borne in long slender panicles on young wood in summer. Prefers full sun and well drained soil.

Buxus - Box

sempervirens - Evergreen, hardy, a good shrub as a specimen shrub for hedge or for topiary. Glossy, very dark green leaves. Clip in spring or late summer then feed. Any soil including chalk, sun, semi-shade or shade.

sempervirens 'Aurea' - a yellow-leaved form of the common Box. Best to avoid hot and dry sites to prevent scorching.

sempervirens 'Suffruticosa' - Evergreen, dwarf shrub that forms a tight, dense mass of oval, bright green leaves. Bears insignificant flowers in late spring or early summer. Trimmed to about 15cm is used for hedging. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 0.75m.

Callistemon - New Zealand Bottle Brush

laevis - we have both yellow and red-flowered types on our sales areas. Evergreen small leaves are topped by large clusters of fluffy flowers with pronounced stamens.

Callicarpa

bodinieri 'Profusion' Deciduous, bushy shrub, very free fruiting. Oval, bronze- purple young foliage. Tiny star-shaped lilac flowers in mid summer are followed by dense clusters of spherical, violet fruits. Requires full sun and well drained soil.

Caryopteris

x **clandonensis 'Worcester Gold'** Deciduous, bushy shrub. Masses of blue to purplish-blue flowers appear amid narrowly oval, irregularly toothed, gold-green leaves, from late summer to autumn. Best colour in full sun. Needs well drained soil. Height and spread 60cm.

'Heavenly Blue' - superb blue flowers in late summer. Silver-grey foliage - great bee plant!

Ceanothus - Californian Lilac

thrysiflorus 'Repens' - A medium-sized evergreen shrub with a horizontal habit especially when young. Bears a profusion of deep blue flowers over a long period from spring to early summer. Needs full sun and good drainage.

thrysisiflorus 'Skylark' - A medium-sized evergreen shrub with a profusion of deep blue flowers over a long period from spring to early summer. Needs full sun and good drainage.

Ceratostigma

willmottianum Deciduous, open shrub. Has leaves that turn red in autumn and bright, rich blue flowers from late summer until well into autumn. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 1m.

Cercidiphyllum - Katsura Tree

japonicum - A strong growing, spreading, deciduous large shrub from Japan. The leaves, bronze when young, turn rich green, then yellow to purple in the autumn when the tree gives off a sweet burnt sugar smell. sun or part shade with moist deep fertile, acidic soil.

Chimonanthus - Winter Sweet

praecox - Deciduous, bushy shrub. Has oval, rough, glossy, dark green leaves. Bears very fragrant many-petalled, cup shaped yellow flowers with purple centres, on bare branches in mild periods during winter. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 2.5m. Spread 3m.

Choisya - Mexican Orange Blossom

'Aztec Pearl' - An easy to grow, evergreen, small shrub with aromatic, delicate, bright green foliage. Covered in fragrant white flowers in May and June and again in late summer. Prefers some wall protection in cold sites. Plant in sun or semi-shade, any soil.

ternata - Evergreen, neat, rounded, dense shrub with aromatic glossy, bright green leaves composed of 3 leaflets. Clusters of fragrant, white blooms open in late spring and often occur again in autumn. Prune lightly in June to encourage flowers. Sun or part shade, any soil even clay. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.2m.

ternata 'Sundance' - Evergreen, neat, rounded, dense shrub with aromatic glossy, yellow green leaves composed of 3 leaflets. Clusters of fragrant, white blooms open in late spring

Cistus - Rock Rose

x salvifolius - Evergreen bushy shrub with grey-green downy stems and leaves. Frost hardy. Purple-pink flowers with paler centres are borne during early to mid summer. Requires full sun and light, well drained soil. Height 60cm. Spread 1m.

x corbariensis - A small/medium sized evergreen shrub. Dark green leaves with red wood for winter interest. Rosy pink buds and cup shaped white flowers with a yellow flush at base. Flowers most of the summer. Needs a well drained soil and flowers best in sun.

'Grayswood Pink' - Soft evergreen grey/green foliage. Clear pink saucer shaped flowers in summer. Hardy if in a well drained soil in full sun. Winter wet in a heavy cold soil will kill plant. Height & spread 80cm (30").

x pulverulentus 'Sunset' - Evergreen compact bush with small undulating sage green leaves. Vivid cerise coloured flowers, produced profusely at intervals until October. Requires sheltered position in full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 80cm.

x purpureus - Evergreen, bushy, rounded shrub. All summer produces saucer shaped, deep purplish-pink flowers, each blotched with deep red. Leaves are narrowly lance shaped and grey-green. Does well in all well drained soil, even poor thin ones and loves sun. Height 1.2m. Spread 1.5m.

x **purpureus 'Alan Fradd'** - Evergreen shrub with large saucer shaped flowers with delicate, almost papery petals. The flowers are white with a dark chocolate brown blotch at the base of each petal. Thrives best in full sun and well drained, even poor, soils. Winter wet in a heavy cold soil will kill plant. Height & spread 80cm (30").

Cornus - Dogwood

Versatile plants for the winter garden, providing great stem colour. New forms with variegated summer foliage followed by bright red winter stems are now available.

alba 'Aurea' - Vigorous, deciduous shrub. Young shoots are red. Soft yellow leaves and small, creamy-white flowers in late spring and early summer followed by white fruits. Easy to grow, prune hard in spring. Sun or shade, any soil. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.5m.

alba 'Elegantissima' - Vigorous, deciduous shrub. Young shoots are bright red in winter. Has white edged grey-green leaves and small, creamy-white flowers in late spring and early summer followed by white fruits. Easy to grow, prune hard in spring. Sun or shade, any soil. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.5m.

alba 'Kesselringii' - Vigorous, deciduous shrub with deep purplish stems. Dark green leaves become flushed reddish-purple in autumn. Creamy white flowers in late spring and early summer are followed by white fruits. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 1.6m.

alba 'Spaethii' - Deciduous shrub with brightly coloured stems in winter and conspicuously golden variegated leaves. Requires any reasonable soil. Grows in full sun or partial shade. Height up to 2m.

mas - Deciduous, bushy, dense shrub or small tree. Small, star shaped, yellow flowers appear on bare branches in early spring. Bright red, edible, fleshy fruits appear in late summer. Sun or semi-shade and any soil.

sanguinea - The '*Common Dogwood*'. Our native, deciduous hedgerow species with greenish, red-flushed stems and rich purple autumn colour. Fruits are bitter to the taste and black.

Corylus - Hazel

avellana - Deciduous, small tree or large shrub. British native '*Hazel Nut*'. Bears long yellow catkins from February to March. Splendid golden autumn colour. Invaluable for bleak sites in any reasonable soil. Useful tall screening shrub. Sun or partial shade.

avellana 'Contorta' - *Corkscrew Hazel* Deciduous, small, slow growing tree or large shrub, which grows to about 3 m and has curiously twisted branches & leaves. A beautiful feature in winter, when branches are hung with long yellow 'lamb's tails'. Prefers a moist soil or retentive soil in sun or shade. On light soils tree is better in shade.

maxima 'Purpurea' - *Purple Filbert*. Purple catkins with yellow anthers in spring before the leaves. Dark purple leaves and then, if you are lucky, and wildlife does not beat you to it, purple nuts. Can grow up to 2m in height and spread. Sun or part shade and any soil that is not too dry.

Cotinus - Smoke Tree

coggygria - Deciduous shrub, which is grown for foliage. Smooth, rounded green leaves

provide good autumn colours. Fully hardy. In June and July long, plume-like, fawn-coloured, later turning smokey-grey, flowers are produced in profusion. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 5m

cogygria 'Royal Purple' - Deciduous, bushy shrub. Leaves are rounded, rich purple all summer, becoming yellow or red in autumn. June/July masses of tiny off-white flowers stalks form showy plume-like clusters. Thrives in sun or partial shade. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.5m.

Cotoneaster

Invaluable plants - either evergreen or deciduous, growing in almost any position, providing excellent flowers and berries.

dammeri - Deciduous, prostrate shrub with long, trailing shoots. Leaves are oval, prominently veined and 2-4cm long. In autumn shoots are studded with sealing-wax-red fruits. Ideal for covering banks or as ground-cover beneath other shrubs.

horizontalis 'Variegata' - Deciduous, spreading shrub with variegated leaves. Good autumn colour. Pinkish-white flowers in spring are followed by small red berries. Grows in sun or shade and well drained soil. Easy. Good ground cover or against walls. Height 1.5 m. Spread 2m.

horizontalis - a well-known plant. Deciduous, herring-bone growth. Excellent autumn colour and berry.

franchetii - semi-evergreen upright shrub, silver-backed leaves and masses of berries.

lacteus - Evergreen, arching shrub suitable for hedging. Oval, dark green leaves set off shallowly cup shaped, white flowers from early to mid-summer. Long-lasting, red fruits are carried in large clusters in autumn-winter. Requires full sun and well drained soil.

'Rothschildianus' - an unusual evergreen variety with masses of yellow berries in autumn. Wide and spreading growth habit.

Deutzia

hybrida 'Pink Pompon' - An excellent early-summer flowering shrub with a profusion of double pink flowers at first, becoming white, appearing from late May into early June. Better in full sun. Prune out a few of the older stems every few years to improve vigour

hybrida 'Pride of Rochester' - an upright deciduous shrub with double pinky-white flowers.

hybrida 'Magicien' - a superb new variety smothered in pink and white single flowers. Often repeat flowers in late summer.

Elaeagnus

commutata - A rare shrub with leaves of an intense silver. Abundant small insignificant flowers, with heady, jasmine-like scent, particularly noticeable on warm evenings, appear in May and June. Occasional small egg-shaped, silvery fruits. A lovely plant for near a seating area. Withstands quite poor soils and dryness once established.

.pungens 'Maculata' - Evergreen, brilliant golden variegated, bushy, slightly spiny shrub. Glossy, dark green leaves with deep golden/yellow centre patch. Very fragrant, creamy-white flowers, mid to late autumn. Sun and well drained soil. Easy, minimal pruning.

x ebbingei - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub. Fully hardy. Has oblong to oval, glossy, dark green leaves, silvery beneath. Excellent as a specimen or dense screen. Mature plants bear fragrant flowers in autumn on old wood. Full sun or semi-shade.

x **ebbingei 'Gilt Edge'** - Evergreen, bushy shrub with glossy, dark green leaves, silver beneath, centrally marked yellow and pale green. Bears small, fragrant, white flowers in autumn. Plant in sun or semi-shade. Height 3m. Spread 2m.

x **ebbingei 'Limelight'** - Evergreen, bushy shrub with glossy, dark green leaves, silver beneath, centrally marked yellow and pale green. Bears small, fragrant, white flowers in autumn. Plant in sun or semi-shade.

Escallonia

'**Apple Blossom**' - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub. From early to mid summer, apple blossom pink flowers are borne in profusion amid glossy, dark green leaves. Plant in sun or semi-shade in well-drained soil.

'**Crimson Spire**' - An evergreen shrub with red clusters of summer flowers. Can be trimmed as hedging if required. Tolerant of most soils and situations.

'**Donard Seedling**' - Vigorous evergreen arching shrub with small glossy dark green leaves. Masses of pink buds opening to white blooms. Full sun and well-drained soil.

Rubra var. macrantha - the finest Escallonia in foliage. Large glossy dark-green leaves set off clusters of dark red flowers in mid-late summer.

Euonymus

europaeus - Deciduous, small tree or large shrub. The bark is smooth and grey at first, later becoming pink tinged and shallowly fissured. Leaves are oval, dark glossy green, turning purple-orange in autumn. White flowers appear in May to June and are followed by pink fruits.

fortunei 'Emerald & Gold' - Evergreen, attractive golden variegated hummock-forming shrub, turning bronzy pink in winter. Will thrive in most conditions and is exceptionally hardy. Good all year colour and as backdrop for other shrubs and perennials.

fortunei 'Emerald Gaiety' - Evergreen, invaluable, bushy, spreading or climbing shrub. Grown for it's white edged deep green leaves, showing a pink-white edge in autumn/winter. Sun or shade, any soil. Easy, minimal pruning. Looks good all year round. Height 60cm. Spread 1.5m.

fortunei 'Silver Queen' - Evergreen, bushy shrub with a dense growth of dark green leaves, broadly edged with white. Produces insignificant, greenish white flowers in spring. Will climb slowly. Thrives in most conditions.

japonicus - A slow growing evergreen bush. Leathery green leaves - giving all year round interest. Eventually makes a dense bush of 1.8m. Good in most soils in sun or part shade.

japonicus 'Microphyllus Pulchellus' - Slow growing evergreen shrub of dense, compact habit with small, narrow leaves suffused with gold. Somewhat resembles 'Box' in appearance.

For Exochorda see Climbers and Wall Shrubs Section

Fatsia

japonica - Evergreen, exotic looking shrub. Large lobed, glossy green leaves. Dense clusters of white flowers on mature plants from October to November, followed by black fruits.

Requires sheltered site in sun or shade. Fertile, well drained soil. Height and spread 3m.

X Fatshedera Lizei

A curious plant - the result of a cross between Fatsia and Hedera. Evergreen lobed glossy

dark green foliage - topped by clusters of white Ivy-like flowers in late summer. Very upright growing. Will often take on purplish autumn tints in cold areas. Well-drained soil and partial shade preferred.

Forsythia - Golden Bell Bush

'Fiesta' - Compact, deciduous shrub growing to 1m. Rich, green foliage with bright cream and gold central leaf variegation and golden yellow flowers in spring. Any well drained soil in sun or part shade.

'Goldtide' - Ground covering forsythia which colonises by rooting its horizontal branches. Light green slender leaves. Large yellow grapefruit yellow flowers.

'Arnold Dwarf' - as the name suggests a low-growing ground-covering Forsythia with small twiggy growth and masses of yellow flowers in spring.

Fuchsia - Hardy

Magellanica 'Alba' - masses of white drooping flowers in late summer. Very pretty. Upright growth - best pruned hard back each April to promote flowering.

tricolour - a beautiful variegated form with small leaves margined silver/red and white most attractive - followed by bright red hanging tubular flowers in late summer.

Griselinia

littoralis - Evergreen, fast growing shrub of dense habit. Large, oval or ovate yellowish-green leaves. Tolerant of salt-laden winds. Good hedge plant. May be damaged by severe frost, usually recovers. Will grow in sun or shade. Height 3m+. Spread 1.8m.

littoralis 'Variegata' - Evergreen, upright shrub of dense, bushy habit. Leathery leaves are grey-green, marked with bright green and creamy-white. Bears inconspicuous, yellow-green flowers in late spring. Needs shelter. Will grow in sun or shade. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.2m.

Hebe

rakiensis - small dome-like habit, small evergreen leaves topped by spikes of white flowers in summer. Very attractive in small gardens.

Helicrysum - Curry Plant

italicum - A very nice evergreen. Silvery leaves, which smell of curry when crushed on a compact plant. Small yellow flowers in late summer. Sun and good drainage essential.

Hydrangea - Shrubby

macrophylla 'Mariesii Variegata' - *Lace-Cap*. Distinctive foliage, green edged yellow and white. Bears large rosy-pink heads of flowers from July to October. Well-drained soil preferred.

paniculata 'Pink Diamond' - Medium/large shrub with large heads of sterile florets later ageing to pink.

paniculata 'Blue Wave' - medium/large shrub with large heads of metallic blue in acid soils. If planted in alkaline soil, this will be pink-flowered!!

macrophylla 'Mariesii Variegata' - *Lace-cap Hydrangea* - Distinctive foliage with green, white and greyish-green variegations. Bears large, rosy pink lace cap flowers from July to October.

When grown in suitable soils the flowers turn a very rich blue. Requires well drained soil in a lightly shaded situation.

paniculata 'Pink Diamond' - Medium/large shrub with large heads of sterile florets, white becoming pink.

Hypericum

calycinum - *Rose of Sharon* - Evergreen. Excellent spreading ground cover. Mat-like roots good for binding soil. Large golden-yellow flowers with large stamens - June to September. Like sun/shade and any soil. Easy, tidy in spring by cutting out older stems. Height 3m
Spread - indefinite.

x moserianum 'Tricolour' - Deciduous, arching shrub. Pretty small bowl-shaped, yellow flowers are set off by attractively variegated green/ white and pink leaves. Does best in a free draining soil and a sheltered site. Height and spread 30cm.

Ilex - Holly

aquifolium - *Common Holly* - Evergreen, slow growing, thriving in almost any well drained soil. Dislikes extreme moisture or drought. Requires semi-shade or shade.

aquifolium 'Argentea Marginata' - *Broad Leaved Silver Holly* - Evergreen, free fruiting female shrub. Green stems with silver margined leaves and red berries. Pink young growth. Thrives in any garden soil, sun or shade.

aquifolium 'Bacciflora' - an unusual and attractive Holly with yellow berries.

aquifolium 'J.C. van Tol' - Evergreen, self pollinating holly. Dark, shining, almost spineless green leaves. Produces abundant crops of red berries.

x altaclerensis 'Golden King' - Evergreen, can be grown into a small tree or large shrub. One of the most reliable and effective of the variegated hollies. Strong growing, with smooth or few spined leaves, green with a bold yellow margin. Large red berries appear in winter. FEMALE.

Itea

(for Itea as a wall shrub see Climbers section)

virginica 'Henry's Garnet' - a shrubby suckering Itea. Semi-evergreen foliage that turns purple-red in autumn. White catkin-like flowers in late summer. Any well-drained soils in full sun.

Jasminum - Jasmine

(see also in Climbers Section)

humile 'Revolutum' - an unusual deciduous shrubby Jasmine with divided leaflets and bright yellow unscented flowers in early summer. A strong and vigorous shrub—a beautiful sight in full flower.

nudiflorum - *Winter Jasmine*. Deciduous, arching shrub with oval dark green leaves. Bright yellow flowers appear on slender leafless, green shoots in winter and early spring. Requires full sun/semi-shade and well drained soil. Easy, good trained against a wall or fence. Height . Prefers sun and a good well drained soil. Height 3/4m.

Kerria

japonica 'Plenifolia' - Vigorous, deciduous, graceful shrub. Has green shoots and narrowly

oval, sharply toothed, bright green leaves. Produces large, buttercup-like, double, golden-yellow flowers from mid to late spring. Prefers shade or semi-shade. Height 1.8m. Spread 1.5m.

Kolkwitzia

amabilis 'Pink Cloud' - Deciduous '*Beauty Bush*', arching shrub that bears a mass of bell shaped, pink flowers, amid small, oval, mid green leaves in late spring and early summer. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 3m.

Lavandula - *Lavender*

angustifolia 'Hidcote' - Aromatic evergreen small shrub. Hidcote is a compact form with narrow grey/green leaves and stems 60/80cm in height. Violet flowers in July. Needs a well drained soil and does best in sun. Plant at depth plant has been growing in pot. Trim late August/ early September - no later - removing 2/3rd of seasons growth. This will keep plant neat.

angustifolia 'Munstead' - Evergreen aromatic shrub. A compact form with narrow, green leaves and pale lavender blue flowers. Thrives in full sun and well drained soil. To keep in compact shape, prune back after flowering. Height and spread 60-75cm (24-30").

angustifolia 'Rosea' - Evergreen aromatic shrub with narrow strongly scented leaves. Lavender-pink flowers are borne in early to mid July. Height to 75cm(30")

stoechas 'Papillon' - *French Lavender* - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub. Heads of tiny, fragrant, deep purple flowers, topped by purple bracts, appear in late spring and summer. Mature leaves are silver-grey and aromatic. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 0.5m. Spread 0.5m.

Lavatera - *Mallow*

'Rosea' - Vigorous medium to large sized shrub with lobed grey-downy leaves. Wide funnel shaped deep pink flowers over a long period during summer.

Ligustrum - *Privet*

japonicum - *Japanese Privet* - HARMFUL IF EATEN. Evergreen, dense, bush shrub. Frost hardy. Oval glossy, dark green leaves. From mid-summer to early autumn, large conical panicles of small, tubular, white flowers. Full sun and well drained soil. Height 3m Spread 2m

ovalifolium 'Argenteum' - *Silver Privet* - Evergreen oval leafed privet. Leaves with creamy white margins. Small white flowers in summer. Tolerates most soils and aspects. Attractive grown as a hedge or as a specimen plant. Height 1.8m Spread 1.5m

ovalifolium 'Aureum' - *Golden Privet* - Evergreen/semi-evergreen. Dense shrub with glossy, mid-green and bright yellow leaves. Small white flowers mid-summer, followed by black fruits. Sun/semi-shade, well drained soil. Easy. Trim to keep shape. Height 4m spread 3m

Lonicera - *Shrubby Honeysuckle*

nitida - A dense-habited evergreen, used extensively for hedging, being quick in growth and responding well to clipping. Small ovate glossy green leaves.

nitida 'Baggesen's Gold' - Evergreen shrub with yellow leaves during summer, turning yellow-green in autumn. Sweetly scented ideal for hedging. Prefers a sunny position. Height 1.5m Spread 1.8m.

nitida 'Lemon Beauty' - Evergreen shrub with green leaves, broadly margined with cream. Ideal for hedging, responds well to clipping. Cut out shoots which revert to plain green. Prefers a sunny position. Height 1.5m Spread 1.8m.

nitida 'Silver Beauty' - Evergreen, medium sized bush of loose open habit. Numerous small leaves with silver margins. Good all year interest. Flowers small but insignificant. Cut out shoots which revert to plain green. Makes a neat small hedge. Prefers sun and good soil. Height 60cm - 1m. Spread 60cm.

pileata - Dwarf, semi-evergreen shrub most suitable for under planting and groundcover, particularly in shade. Bright green small leaves. Bears clusters of violet berries.

x purpusii - *Winter-Flowering Honeysuckle*. A truly lovely shrub with clusters of sweetly-scented creamy-white flowers produced in January and February. Dense foliage in summer.

Leycesteria - Pheasant Berry

formosa - An upright deciduous shrub with vibrant green stems in winter. Soft divided leaves in summer, and chains of purple-and white flowers in July, followed by large purple-red berries held in bracts. A nice shrub - often neglected.

Magnolia

We have a range of large flowering-size Magnolias on our Specimen Sales Area. The variety below is only available as young plants.

liliflora 'Betty' - One of a new range of Magnolia - a cross between *stellata* and *liliflora*. These have a long-flowering period—but produce huge quantities of flower. Pointed purple-pink petals and lighter-coloured inner tepals are produced in May and sometimes again in September. Partial shade and well-drained soil required.

Mahoberberis

aquisargentii - Evergreen shrub, dense, upright habit. Irregular shaped leaves, dark green above lighter green below. Soft yellow flowers in clusters in early spring. A hybrid between *Mahonia* and *Berberis*. Any soil and any location. A rare hardy shrub with much to recommend it.

Mahonia

aquifolium - *Oregon Grape* - Evergreen, open shrub. Leaves with glossy, bright green leaflets, often turn red or purple in winter. Bunches of small, yellow flowers in spring are followed by blue-black berries. Requires partial shade & moist soil. Height 1m. Spread 1.5m.

japonica— Magnificent deep green leaves with clusters of long pendent racemes of fragrant lemon-yellow flowers from late autumn to early spring.

Nandina - Sacred Bamboo

domestica - Evergreen. An extremely decorative bamboo like shrub of medium size, with

lone erect unbranched stems. The large compound, green leaves are attractively tinged purplish-red in spring and autumn. Flowers small and white in summer. Red berries in very hot summers.

Olearia - Daisy Bush

x **haastii** - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub, good for hedging. Small, oval, glossy, dark green leaves and is covered with heads of fragrant, daisy-like, white flowers from mid to late summer. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 1.6m. Spread 1.6m.

Osmanthus - False Holly

heterophyllus (aquifolium) - Evergreen, upright shrub. Sharply toothed, holly-like, glossy, dark green leaves. Small, fragrant, white flowers are produced in autumn. Sun or part shade any well drained soil.

Ozothamnus

rosmarinifolius 'Silver Jubilee' - A curious evergreen plant with silvery grey leaves a bit like a cross between Rosemary and Helicrysum!! Needs full sun and good drainage is essential.

Pachysandra

terminalis - a lovely small evergreen sub-shrub suitable for ground cover in deepest shade. Glossy toothed-leaves are topped by spikes of white flowers in summer. Looks lush and green even in winter.

terminalis 'Variegata' - similar to the above - but with a creamy-white margin.

Perovskia - Russian Sage

'**Blue Spire**' - Deciduous, upright sub-shrub. Spikes of violet-blue flowers on grey/white stems appear from late summer to mid-autumn, above aromatic deeply cut, grey/green leaves. Does best in sun and well drained soil. Height 90cm Spread 60cm

Philadelphus - Mock Orange

coronarius 'Aureus' - Deciduous, upright shrub. Fully hardy. Clusters of very fragrant 4 petalled, creamy white flowers are produced in late spring and early summer. Oval, golden yellow, young leaves turn yellow green in summer.

'**Buckley's Quill**' - an unusual variety with semi-double flowers with a slight twirl on the petals.

'**Silver Showers**' - a reliable shrub for summer flower. Smothered in clusters of scented single white flowers. Prune after flowering.

'**Virginal**' - Deciduous, upright shrub. Masses of large sweetly scented, pure white semi-double flowers all summer. Sun/light shade, fertile soil. Easy, prune older shoots back after flowering. Height 3m Spread 2.5m

Phlomis

fruticosa 'Alba' - A rare form of the *Jerusalem Sage* - Evergreen & hardy in well drained soils. Attractive white flowers are produced amid sage-like grey green foliage from early to mid summer. Seed heads are attractive winter feature. Needs full sun and well drained soil.

fruticosa - The original species. Evergreen silver-grey foliage and whorls of yellow flowers in summer.

Phormium - *New Zealand Flax*

tenax - Striking evergreen foliage forming clumps of rigid, leathery sword-like leaves. Bronzy-red flowers are borne in panicles in summer. Any fertile soil and in all aspects. Will tolerate sea wind and industrial pollution.

tenax atropurpurea group - The purple leaved form of the 'New Zealand Flax'. Striking evergreen foliage forming clumps of rigid, leathery sword-like leaves. Bronzy-red flowers are borne in panicles in summer on mature plants. Any fertile soil and in all aspects but must be well drained. Will tolerate sea wind and industrial pollution.

Photinia

serratifolia - Large evergreen shrub. Leaves up to 15cm long are shining dark green and leathery, bright coppery red young leaves throughout the growing season. Flowers during April and May are best following a hot summer, followed by red fruits.

x fraseri 'Red Robin' - Evergreen, upright shrub. Young foliage brilliant red maturing to green. Occasional white flowers. Good for sun or part shade on well drained, even chalky soils. Shelter from cold winds. Regular pruning promotes young red growth.

Phygelius - *Cape Fuchsia*

'African Queen' - a pretty evergreen suckering sub-shrub with tubular flowers of red and yellow in late summer. Full sun and well-drained soil required.

'Coral' - A new variety with a stunning coral-red-pink flower—very freely produced in late July and August.

Physocarpus

opulifolius 'Diablo' - Deciduous, dark purple leaves. White tinged pink flowers in late spring, followed by red fruits. Very attractive winter peeling bark. Sun/semi-shade, fertile, well drained soil. Easy, prune after flowering. Height 1.5 Spread 1m

Pittosporum

tenuifolium - Evergreen, columnar or conical shrub of dense bushy habit. Rounded, glossy-green leaves. Small, greenish-purple scented flowers in spring - summer. Requires full sun and well-drained soil, some protection may be needed in very cold weather.

heterophyllum - A relatively recent introduction. Evergreen leaves set off small clusters of deliciously-scented creamy-yellow flowers in June. Full sun and well-drained soil required.

Potentilla - *Shrubby Cinquefoil*

fruticosa 'Elizabeth' - Small dome shaped bush. Large rich canary-yellow flowers from late spring to early autumn. Height to 1m spread to 1.2m.

fruticosa 'Primrose beauty' - An attractive dwarf ground-covering shrub with silvery foliage and creamy yellow flowers with deeper yellow centres all summer.

fruticosa 'Tangerine' - Dwarf wide spreading shrub forming a dense mound. Pale coppery-yellow flowers. Best grown in partial shade.

Prunus

laurocerasus 'Caucasica' - A hardier form of the 'Common Laurel'. Evergreen, vigorous shrub, wide spreading. Large dark shiny green, leathery leaves. Racemes of small white flowers are borne in April, followed by red cherry-like fruits, later turning black. Ideal as hedging or for shelter in game coverts. Tolerant of shade. Height and spread 6m+.

triloba - a beautiful flowering shrub with small light green leaves - and clusters of pink semi-double flowers in May and June. This flowers on previous years growth, so prune after flowering. Well-drained soil required.

Pyracantha - See Climbers and Wall Shrubs Section

Rhamnus

alaternus 'Argenteovariegata' - an awful name for a lovely plant!! Large bushy evergreen shrub with leaves that are green, marbled grey and silvery-white. Best given some shelter—mature plants bear tiny red-brown flowers and red berries.

Ribes - Flowering Currant

odoratum - *The Buffalo Currant*. Unlike other species—this one has glossy leaves—and clusters of freesia-scented yellow flowers in April and May. On mature plants, black berries follow. A plant that should be in every garden!!

sanguineum 'King Edward' - Bears red-pink drooping flowers in March and April. Looks good with Forsythia. Any soil in any aspect.

x gordonianum - A rare deciduous shrub with drooping flowers—red in bud opening to yellow flushed-red. A refreshing change from the usual flowering currants.

Rosa

We do not carry large-flowered or cluster-flowered types, but we do list a few species that are reliable and show disease resistance.

rugosa - *Ramanas Rose*. Reliable and trouble-free. Light green, healthy foliage and clusters of purple scented flowers in summer.

rugosa 'Alba' - A white flowered version of the above.

pimpinellifolia - a lovely little dwarf rose—very dense and twiggy—the *Scotch* or *Burnet* Rose producing flowers of light pink in May and June followed by small black fruits.

rubiginosa - *Sweet Briar/Elegantine*. Often referred to as the Apple-Scented Rose, this one is grown for it's foliage. After rain or when wet, the foliage gives off a sweet scent.

Rosmarinus - Rosemary

officinalis 'Albus' - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub with aromatic, narrow leaves. Small, white flowers appear from mid-spring to early summer and sometimes in autumn. Used as a culinary herb. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 1.5m. Spread 1.5m.

officinalis 'Miss Jessopp's Upright' - Upright evergreen, compact shrub. From mid to late spring and sometimes again in autumn bears small, 2 lipped, blue flowers amid narrowly

oblong, dark green, aromatic leaves. Ideal for hedging. Height and spread 2m. Requires full sun and well drained soil.

officinalis 'Prostrata' - a prostrate low-growing form - equally as pretty as it's tall cousins.

officinalis 'Rosea' - an unusual pink-flowered Rosemary.

officinalis 'Sissinghurst Blue' - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub with aromatic, narrow leaves. Small, purplish-blue to blue flowers appear from mid-spring to early summer and sometimes in autumn. Used as a culinary herb. Requires full sun and well drained soil.

Rubus

'Beneden' - Deciduous, arching, thornless shrub with peeling bark. Large, rose-like pure white flowers are borne among lobed, deep green leaves in late spring and early summer. Full or part sun and well drained soil. Height 3m. Spread 3m.

cockburnianus - Strong growing medium sized shrub with striking purple arching stems with a vivid white bloom. Fern like leaves, white beneath.

tricolor - Prostrate, evergreen shrub with both arching and creeping shoots, covered in red bristles. Glossy, dark green leaves, heart shaped at the base and white-hairy beneath. Single, saucer-shaped white flowers in summer, followed by raspberry like red fruits

Salix Shrubby Willows

eleagnos A beautiful, medium-sized to large shrub of dense, bushy habit. The leaves are like elongated leaves of rosemary, greyish hoary at first becoming green above and white beneath, thickly clothing the slender, reddish-brown, wand-like stems. Catkins are slender appearing with the young leaves in spring.

matsudana 'Tortuosa' - *Dragon's Claw Willow* - Fast-growing, deciduous, large upright shrub with curiously twisted shoots and contorted, narrow, tapering, bright green leaves. Thrives best in moist soil conditions and prefers full sun.

Salvias - Sage

officinalis - *Common Sage*. Grey-green evergreen foliage topped with spikes of blue flowers in late summer. Full sun and good drainage essential.

officinalis 'Icterina' - the gold and green variegated form of the above.

officinalis 'Purpurescens' - the purple-leaved form of the above.

Sambucus - Elder

nigra 'Aureomarginata' - Large, bushy deciduous, upright shrub. Has large leaflets with an irregular creamy-white/yellow margin. The flattened heads of cream-coloured fragrant flowers in June, are followed by heavy bunches of shiny black fruit. Requires full sun. Height & spread 6m

nigra 'Sutherland Gold' - a golden-leaved form, particularly noted for it's resistance to scorching in hot sun.

nigra Thundercloud' - *Purple Leafed Elder* - Deciduous. Dark purple leaves, become bronzy green. Beautiful contrast to the rose colour buds, which open to creamy-white flowers. Easy, fast, any soil or aspect. Height 3m Spread 2.5m or limit by cutting to ground in October.

Santolina - Cotton Lavender

chamaecyparissus - Evergreen, rounded, dense shrub. Shoots are covered with woolly, white growth, and narrowly oblong finely toothed leaves are also white. Bright yellow flower heads are borne in mid-late summer. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 45cm
Spread 80cm

virens - green-leaved dense round shrub with yellow button-like flowers in late summer. Full sun and well-drained soil preferred.

Sarcococca - Christmas Box

confusa - Evergreen. Clump forming shrub. Beautifully scented white flowers all through the late winter. Followed by shining black fruits. Will succeed in any fertile soil, but particularly happy in chalk soils. Will slowly grow up to 1m high, spread 1m.

hookeriana var. digyna - Evergreen, clump forming, suckering, dense shrub with narrow, bright green leaves. Tiny, fragrant, white flowers with pink anthers, open in winter and are followed by spherical, black fruits. Requires partial shade and moist soil. Height and spread 1m.

Senecio

'**Sunshine**' - Attractive shrub forming a dense broad mound up to 1m high. Silvery-grey leaves when young, becoming green above. Large yellow flower heads. Requires full sun and well drained soil.

Solanum - See Climbers and Wall Shrubs

Spiraea

'**Arguta**' - *Bridal Wreath* - Deciduous, arching, dense shrub. Produces clusters of 5-petalled, white flowers from mid to late spring. Leaves are narrowly oblong and bright green. Fully hardy. Requires full sun and fertile, well, drained soil.

prunifolia 'Plena' - Dense shrub with arching branches, leaves oval and finely toothed, orange or red in autumn. Double white flowers are borne in tight, stalkless clusters in April/May. Needs reasonably fertile soil, full sun or partial shade.

thunbergii - A lovely spring-flowering shrub. Long racemes of white flowers smother the branches in May. Superb autumn colour of red and orange in October. Will grow in most soils - in sun or partial shade. Height to 1.8m.

Symphoricarpus

x chenaultii 'Hancock' - Dwarf shrub of wide spreading habit. Excellent for ground cover, particularly beneath trees. Purplish-red berries on exposed sites, or pinkish white elsewhere, are borne on spikes or clusters. Height 0.6-1m.

Tamarix

pentandra—A beautiful deciduous feathery-leaved shrub, smothered in pinky-white flowers in May and June. Prune back after flowering if necessary. Well-drained soil required.

Trachelospermum - See Climbers and Wall Shrubs

Viburnum

davidii - a ground-covering species with handsome large evergreen leaves and red leaf stalks. Mature plants bear blue berries on female plants only.

opulus 'Compactum' - Deciduous, dense shrub. Has deep green leaves red in autumn, and profuse white flowers in spring and early summer followed by bunches of bright red berries. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height and spread 1.5m.

opulus 'Roseum' - *The Snowball Tree* - A very popular flowering shrub, the flowers are all sterile and in conspicuous clusters. A fine sight in full flower, sun or partial shade preferred.

plicatum 'Lanarth' - *Japanese Snowball* - Deciduous, bushy, spreading shrub with tiered branches clothed in dark green leaves, which turn reddish-purple in autumn. Large, rounded head of flowers with white bracts appear in late spring and early summer. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 3m. Spread 5m.

plicatum 'Summer Snowflake' - *Japanese Snowball* - Deciduous, bushy, medium sized shrub, with tiered branches. Lace-cap flower heads are borne throughout summer. Oval green leaves, turn red to purple in autumn.

rhytidophyllum - Vigorous, evergreen, open shrub with large oblong, corrugated leaves, deep glossy green above and densely grey tomentose beneath. Dense heads of small, creamy white flowers in late spring are succeeded by oval red fruits that mature to black. Sun or shade and well drained soil. Height 3m. Spread 3.5m.

tinus - *Laurustinus* - Evergreen. Winter/spring flowering shrub. Dark glossy leaves, white flowers open from pink buds, giving a two colour effect from December to March. Tolerates sun/shade and most soils. Can be used as a hedge or specimen plant. Easy, minimal pruning.

tinus 'Eve Price' - Evergreen. Winter/spring flowering shrub here grown as a standard. Dark glossy leaves, white flowers open from pink buds, giving a two colour effect from December to March. Tolerates sun/shade and most soils. Prune to retained shape after flowering.

tinus 'Gwenllian' - Evergreen, bushy, dense shrub with oval dark green leaves. Freely produced flat heads of small, white blooms, open from pink buds during late winter and spring. Blue berries may follow. Withstands shade, cold wind and most soils. Height 3m Spread 2m.

tinus 'Purpureum' - a variety with purple-tints to the foliage when young.

x bodnantense 'Dawn' - Deciduous, upright shrub with oval, bronze, young leaves that mature to dark green. Racemes of deep pink buds open to fragrant pink flowers during mild periods from late autumn to early spring. Requires full sun and well drained soil. Height 3m. Spread 2.8m.

x burkwoodii - Semi-evergreen, bushy, open shrub. Fully hardy. Mid/late spring brings round heads of beautifully fragrant white flowers, which are pink in bud. Glossy dark green leaves. Sun or part sun with a well drained soil. Height and spread 1.8m

x carlcephalum - A splendid medium-sized shrub, compact habit producing clusters of large very fragrant flowers, pink in bud in May. One of the best early summer flowering shrubs around. Any well drained fertile soil in sun or part shade. Good autumnal colours.

Weigela

florida nana 'Variegata' - Deciduous - dwarf form. Pale pink foxglove-like flowers, set off beautifully by crisp green leaves, which have a creamy yellow edge. Easy to grow, in sun/semi-shade and fertile soil. Prune out old stems that have flowered. Height and spread 0.5–0.75m.

florida 'Red Prince' - An outstanding new variety with bright red flowers very profusely borne. This one produces a second crop of blooms in September. A huge improvement over the older types.

florida 'Victoria' - A beautiful early summer flowering shrub to 2m high. Profuse quantities of pink flowers appear in June. Prune after flowering only. Best in sun or partial shade.

praecox - Deciduous, vigorous, upright shrub. Dainty pink and white flowers with a yellow throat are borne in early summer and often again in autumn. Full sun preferred.

CLIMBERS AND WALL SHRUBS

Our range of these beauties has steadily increased in the past few years. The types we offer can quickly transform a stark wall or fence into a beautiful screen or bower.

Abeliophyllum - White Forsythia

distichum - A seldom-seen shrub. Fragrant white flowers in clusters in late February and March. Best against a warm South or West-facing wall to protect the flowers from frost. Good autumn leaf colour.

Clematis

The undisputed 'Queen of Climbers'. There are literally hundreds of varieties - only the species are listed here, but we usually have a range of large-flowered Hybrids on our sales areas.

armandii - One of the few evergreen Clematis species. Magnificent when well-grown. Huge long thick glossy leaves set off clusters of sweetly-scented white flowers in April. Best on a sheltered wall—but surprisingly tough once established.

cirrhuosa - A winter-flowering species. It reliably produces clusters of nodding white and cream bell-like flowers in January and February, over ferny semi-evergreen foliage. A choice plant for the winter garden.

tangutica - A strong growing climber or scrambler. Prettily-divided foliage, and large bell-like nodding yellow flowers in late summer. A very under-rated species.

vitalba - *Old Man's Beard*. The wild and beautiful hedgerow Clematis. Rampant growth, ideal for scrambling up into trees and hedgerows. Small nodding creamy flowers are followed by huge heads of fluffy seeds - providing a spectacular sight in autumn.

Exochorda - Pearlbush

'**The Bride**' - A beautiful deciduous shrub - looking great when allowed to trail down from

a wall or fence. Light green leaves and cluster of white flowers with a dark eye in May. Good autumn colour.

Garrya - Silk Tassel Bush

elliptica - A magnificent evergreen best used as a wall shrub. Long drooping silky catkins in January and February - tough glossy foliage.

Hedera - Ivy

'**Clotted Cream**' - small silver and gold evergreen foliage.

colchica '**Dentata Variegata**' - a mouthful of a name for a lovely plant. Large thick evergreen glossy leaves with a silver/gold margin.

'**Goldheart**' - small-leaved with a bronze/gold centre to the leaf.

'**Sagittifolia**' - very small-leaved. Evergreen sharply-toothed foliage.

Hydrangea

petiolaris - Deciduous woody-stemmed root climber. Toothed leaves and clusters of small-white flowers in July and August. Self-clinging and suitable for a North or East-facing wall. Attractive peeling brown bark in winter.

Itea

illicifolia - A seldom seen plant. Evergreen toothed foliage, overhung by long fragrant catkin-like tassels in July and August. Best on a warm wall.

Jasminum - Jasmine

nudiflorum - *Winter Jasmine*. This well-known plant is often overlooked - but little else produces such a good show in the depths of winter. Deciduous divided leaves and long arching stems smothered in bright yellow unscented flowers from November-January.

officinale - semi-evergreen or deciduous depending upon aspect. A dense twining climber with divided soft leaves and clusters of very fragrant white flowers in July and August. Excellent for planting near seating areas

officinale '**Fiona Sunrise**' - A golden-leaved Jasmine. White fragrant flowers during summer.

x stephanense - Another beautiful climber. The fragrant flowers are pale-pink in late July and August. The young leaves are often variegated, changing to pale green in summer.

Lonicera - Climbing Honeysuckle

japonica '**Hall's Prolific**' - A semi-evergreen twining climber. Lush light-green leaves and superbly fragrant clusters of creamy-white flowers from June to October. Ideal for pergolas. Height to 4m

japonica '**Repens**' - a beautiful variety whose young growth is flushed vivid purple, later followed by sweetly-scented creamy-white purple-flushed flowers from June to October.

japonica '**Mint Crisp**' - A superb new variety with evergreen foliage and a subtle hint of cream and pink variegation. Flowers are creamy-yellow and very sweetly-scented.

periclymenum '**Belgica**' - Early Dutch Honeysuckle. A familiar plant - with dark purple-tinted young foliage and clusters of yellow flowers with purple-red outer petals, sweetly-scented in May.

periclymenum 'Serotina' - Late Dutch Honeysuckle. A vigorous climber with sweetly-fragrant flowers from July-October. The outer petals are purple-red with inner yellow and cream anthers.

x americana - A beautiful climber with a rounded leaf. Pure-white flowers - powerfully scented - fading to yellow in June and July. Often produces clusters of red berries in autumn.

Parthenocissus - Virginia Creeper

quinquefolia - Deciduous self-clinging climber with incredible autumn colour. The foliage turns to a rich scarlet in October. On mature plants, small flowers are followed by blue-black berries in autumn. Semi-shade preferred. Ht to 10m or can be pruned to suit.

'Veitchii' - A self-clinging vine, whose young growth is flushed purple. Dense foliage turns bright red/purple in autumn. Often better-suited where space is at a premium than the above species.

Passiflora - Passion Flower

caerulea - A beautiful semi-evergreen climber with unique stunning large white and blue flowers in late summer. In sheltered sites, these can be followed by egg-shaped orange fruits. Sun and well-drained soil preferred. Best on South or West-facing aspects.

Pyracantha - Firethorn

'Orange Glow' - A dense vigorous shrub - excellent for North or East-facing sites. The branches are covered in autumn with a profusion of bright-orange berries. Evergreen foliage and thorny stems.

'Saphyr Juane' - a yellow-berried form - notable for it's resistance to Fireblight.

'Saphyr Rouge' - A medium-sized upright evergreen shrub with profuse clusters of red berries in autumn. Notable for it's resistance to Fireblight.

Solanum - Potato Vine

crispum 'Glasnevin' - Vigorous semi-evergreen woody scrambling climber with oval small leaves and dense clusters of purple-lilac flowers with an orange centre in late summer. It produces a spectacular display when well-grown. Prefers full sun and a sheltered site.

jasminoides 'Album' - Fast-growing slender-stemmed climber. Semi-evergreen leaves with a purplish tint are topped in late summer by large clusters of white flowers with a yellow-orange centre. This species prefers a sheltered site - and will suffer dieback in extreme cold winters.

Trachelospermum - Star Jasmine

jasminoides - A choice evergreen woody climber or wall shrub. Small oval leaves are topped by clusters of very sweetly-scented flowers in late summer. Requires full sun and shelter, with a well-drained soil preferred.

Wisteria

We have a range of these wonderful twining climbers. We offer mature plants that will produce a wonderful show in spring of sweetly-scented long hanging chains of flowers, ranging from blue to white.
